BIKE AND BUILD PROJECT 2019

This year, the Bike and Build group will be coming on Saturday afternoon, August 17, and leaving on Monday morning, August 19. The group will have about 35 riders. They will be working with Bonner Homeless Transitions, as they did last year. On arrival on Saturday afternoon, we will need some drivers to shuttle the bike riders to and from the YMCA facility where the riders will be able get showers. Our church will provide space for the riders to stay overnight for Saturday and Sunday nights. We will provide meals for them on Saturday night and Monday morning. We should provide some breakfast snacks for them on Sunday morning, but they basically will be working with Bonner Homeless Transitions, who will be giving them lunch and dinner on Sunday. There will be some riders who are vegetarians, and we will provide the count as the dates are closer.

A signup sheet will be provided later for the particular needs involved. We appreciate everyone's help with this project. These riders are a great group of people who are doing a well needed service for the towns and cities they serve across the country.

THE SESSION SUMMARY – JUNE 2019

During its June 18 meeting, Session decided to create a Session Summary for the church newsletter, The Grapevine. We did this a number of years ago and called it *Session Mini-Minutes*. As the current clerk of session, I will now dub this regular column as *The Session Summary*.

Building and Grounds

Cynthia Dalsing, announced the good news that testing of the broken floor tiles from Fellowship Hall revealed very low amounts of asbestos, far below any threshold of concern. Therefore, a simple replacement of about a dozen tiles will get us by until requiring a complete floor replacement. We won't have to call in the people wearing white suits and masks for a simple job that we can do ourselves.

The new church entryway facing Fourth Avenue is nearing completion but likely won't be finished by the Peace Market Celebration on June 22. Before too long, however, we will be stepping up the "Stairway to Heaven."

Pastor Andy is moving ... but not very far ... just across the hall. With the aesthetic appearance of the Peace Garden growing every day, the current nursery room will be converted into a Pastor's Study. Pastor Andy's new view will allow him to enjoy the calming effect of green grass, flowers and trees instead of a busy alley and fast food drive-thru. The children will enjoy the larger space as the Pastor's old office transitions into a kid-friendly zone.

New Policies Regarding Petitions and Newsletter Content

Session approved the following two policies:

- 1) Only church related petitions, approved by Session, can be circulated within the church.
- 2) The final editing and content of *The Grapevine* newsletter resides with the Pastor, Clerk of Session and an ad hoc Member At Large.

These policies followed a serious discussion to ensure that we always protect the sacredness, peace, and unity of our church, and the sense of sanctuary and community the church provides for a diverse membership.

Stewardship and Finance

Dyno Wahl reported that as of the five month period ending May 2019, total income amounted to \$67,066 which offset expenses of \$60,791. Budgeted income for this same time period was forecasted to be \$57,292. This is good news indeed as summer giving usually takes a dip. Everyone is encouraged to stay current in maintaining a proper stewardship.

May God continue to bless our church and all who gather to worship with us.

July 22-25 for Kids Alive Day Camp! The theme, "Adventure Awaits!" is guided by Ephesians 5:1-2b, "Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Jesus loved us." If you feel led to volunteer for this grand adventure, please contact the church office. There are several ways to participate. We do background screenings for the Presbyterian leadership involved in working directly with the children. This ministry to the community is in partnership with First Lutheran Church and Sandpoint United Methodist Church, and each year blesses our community with a joyful way to learn about Jesus.

First Presbyterian Church is responsible, especially, for Monday's program, on the theme "Jesus Loves." In addition, Monday will be called, "Bold Color Day" so kids and adults can wear bright clothing. The Lutherans are doing Crazy Hair Day on Tuesday, and the Methodists lead Crazy Sock Day on Wednesday. Thursday, Luther Park staff will host Backwards Day, and outfits will be worn in reverse.

On their day, each church is responsible to provide:

- * breakfast items for the Lutherhaven Camp staff
- * registration helpers for sign-in beginning at 8:30 a.m.
- * snacks for about 50 campers: snacks of goldfish crackers, mini-pretzels, and fresh fruit
- * 75 otter pops, the smaller size, already frozen ahead of time
- * dinner for the Lutherhaven Camp staff, either hosting directly or as a gift certificate to eat out Contact the church office for more information, or to coordinate helping this ministry take place.



STAIRWAY TO HEAVEN UPDATE

The Stairway to Heaven project continues and the front entry is taking shape. Todd Vorhies, the General Contractor, recently gave an update on the project, including:

- All the large timbers are now in place
- Applied a final finish coat of stain to the timbers
- The tongue & groove ceiling will go on next week
- The metal hand railing contractor is backed up, but the railing is being fabricated this week
- Many people walking by give positive feedback and seem to like it
- The roof decking is going on well, and will be completed with the decking, roof sheathing and protective tar paper. The composition roofing (shingles) is ordered.
- We will have the scaffolding down by the end of the week
- The finger labyrinth on the wood slab is going to Makerspoint to process. It shall be stained to match the lighter roof deck color.
- Lighting.... The timber awning is wired to receive a central light fixture.
- the new sidewalk will go in soon

The Congregation goal of raising \$25,000 to match the Building Fund in order to reach the \$50,000 project amount is going well. After a change order to address the sidewalks, the project amount is now \$53,000, but there is money in the Building Fund to cover the difference. As of this publication the congregation amount raised is \$24,689.75. Thank you to everyone who has supported this project! We are very close to reaching our goal!

Sunday September 8 is the official Ribbon Cutting for the front Entry, Gazebo, and Community Peace Garden. Worship will begin at 10:30, followed by the outdoor events and a potluck.

Remember that while it is tempting to see the new steps as a lovely way to get people into the church, more importantly the new steps are to facilitate the church in the mission of going out to connect with the community and neighborhood. Let's continue to put our best foot forward as people sent as the Body of Christ into the world.
