From the Pastor...

On Tuesday, June 22, 2021, I hosted the afternoon book study and contemplative prayer group at my house. After sharing some iced tea and lemonade in the shade of the front porch, we moved into the cool of the closed-up house. I felt a blessing fill the space of my living room as over ten of us observed a silent, contemplative sit for 20 minutes. The unity of God's love unfolding and connecting things seen and unseen is amazing and filled with grace. We then went outside for a walk along the meditative path I mowed into the lawn, a prayer labyrinth shared with the clover and the honeybees. It was fabulous to also show people my "beehouse" which is the outbuilding that shelters several A-Z Hives. The beehouse is a place for beekeeping, meditation, and connecting with Christ who is in all things. This was the first group to visit the beehouse, and it was a real blessing!

One of my friends from college is a flight nurse on Lifeflight and snapped a quick photo of our place on one of his recent voyages out of Sandpoint. From the air, everything is visible, the labyrinth, the beehouse, gardens, the house, barn, trees and chicken coop. What the picture can't show are the people. We weren't home on Sunday morning. It doesn't show the miniature horse or the old goat, who were shaded in the barn. And the bees flying around are not visible. Although the gardens are there, individual blooms of flowers don't have the same effect from that sort of altitude.

Sometimes we can't see the inner workings of the Holy Spirit, but God's love is always there. Staying open to this Living Presence and trusting Christ's love are at the heart of faith. Prayerful disciplines, like walking a labyrinth, sitting in silence, or spending time with a group to share how God is active in our lives all help us to keep Jesus as our focus rather than get caught up in our own self-importance and agendas.

If you want to walk the labyrinth, come on over! You may need an umbrella for shade these days. The heat of a climate crisis reminds us that many problems cannot be solved by the same mentality that created them. A new consciousness is needed, a transformed heart. May we be new creations in Christ and responsive to God's creative power, one step at a time.

THE SESSION SUMMARY JUNE 22, 2021

Since I missed this meeting, I thank Judy Labrie for taking notes. As usual, her notes are thorough along with impeccable penmanship.

In reviewing our COVID 19 policies, Session agreed to continue the current protocols for Sunday worship services. These include voluntary masks, open seating, and communion on the first Sunday of the month featuring the bread only. In regard to reopening church facilities to outside groups, PFLAG will return for their bi-monthly meetings in July on the second and fourth Tuesday evenings. The Al-Anon and AA groups have resumed weekly meetings on Monday and Wednesday evenings and Thursday at noon and Thursday evening. These meetings will require additional janitorial services.

Don and Sue Helander recently met with Todd Vorhies to schedule the maintenance project for the exterior woodwork on the exterior of the sanctuary. He is also the contractor we hired for the front entryway. Todd expects to begin this project in several weeks.

Unfortunately we received notice that our grant application to the Presbytery of Inland Northwest to enhance live-streaming Sunday worship services by purchasing a camera and computer equipment was not approved. Session had previously approved a contingency plan using Memorial Funds and the project will move forward as planned.

While giving the monthly financial report, Paula Vincent, Stewardship and Finance Elder, announced that she recently accepted a year-long school superintendent position in her home state of Iowa. We will miss Paula's superb leadership and wish her well as she continues her passion for education. She will continue to serve in some capacity, as Zoom now allows remote participation in meetings. We look forward to her return to Idaho.

Pastor Andy recently hosted the book study/contemplative prayer group at his home for a bee house tour and to walk a mowed labyrinth pathway.

Pastor Andy and Shawna will be away on study leave and vacation from September 7 through October 15, dependent upon international travel availability. Mickie Quinn, Worship and Music Elder, will arrange pulpit supply during this time, in coordination with the Session

Session will take its usual summer recess until September 21. Pastor Steve Neuder will serve as guest moderator for this meeting.

I hope we can work to get it designated as an official wilderness, because for me and the others gathered on that summit, it was inspiring like only that place can be.

Thank you, Friends of Scotchman Peaks Wilderness, for the obvious care given to trail maintenance, along with volunteer Trail Ambassadors educating about protections for mountain goats and the habitat they depend on. 

EVENTS AND OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES

Pastor Andy and Sharon Anderson facilitated a study called *Embracing an Alternative Orthodoxy* - *the Legacy of St Francis*. The 5-session study was held Tuesday evenings, April 27 to May 25, offered both in-person, meeting at the First Presbyterian Church (FPC), and accessed virtually via the Zoom platform. The series included DVD presentations to explore facets of Christian faith informed by contemplation, mysticism, compassion, justice, and centuries of rich Christian history.

There were 16 participants plus the facilitators. Zoom helped connect people from Kalispell and Darby, MT, western Oregon, and Utah. Five participants were friends or members of FPC. Most everyone shared they would be interested in other studies by the Center for Action and Contemplation.

As another outreach event, FPC has been invited to have a booth at the first ever Pride Festival in Sandpoint. Session has approved church participation. The Sandpoint branch of PFLAG (Parents & Friends of Lesbians And Gays), is a local LGBTQ+ family and ally organization. PFLAG holds support meetings at FPC twice a month, the second and fourth Tuesday evenings. With help from the larger community and sponsorship of local businesses, PFLAG will host the event on Saturday, July 17, in the parking lot of Matchwood Brewing and Evans Brothers Coffee.
