From the Pastor...

Happy Epiphany! God is with us! This season we especially celebrate Christ in our midst. But do we really know what this looks like as one day leads to another? Perhaps the best we can do is trust the moment while we lean into an unfolding future with the eyes and ears of our heart open.

This January, I took some time to focus on creating a plan for this year's Sabbatical, which will be in May, June, and July. Unlike the previous Sabbatical that featured an extensive application process for the Lilly Foundation's Clergy Renewal program, this year's approach has been less intense. For the 2023 Sabbatical, only one grant is in process, this one with the Board of Pensions of the Presbyterian Church (USA) for sabbatical support. The maximum award is \$4,000. This combines with just over \$4,000 that is saved from the Pastor's unused Study Leave funds, and the congregation has another \$5,000 plus for the congregation side to cover pulpit supply and other expenses.

As the days of planning unfold, it is amazing to see an itinerary take shape, then morph, then reshape, then get closer to a conclusion. The active work of God is visible in having a hand in bringing things to awareness along the way that may have otherwise been overlooked. Through patient partnering with the Spirit, the power of creativity is revealed. There is energy and excitement with that process, a deep knowing that we are not alone charting a course in ministry, but instead we serve a risen Savior who invites us to follow.

Themes have emerged that focus on contemplative prayer, God's unfolding creativity inviting us to an integral consciousness, and ecospirituality through Celtic wisdom and the art of beekeeping. These all intertwine through periods of travel and reflection. It may be possible to visit, for example, ancient forest groves while camping in Redwoods National and State Parks in California. Then, to see the evolution of consciousness revealed through the artwork of Picasso at the museum in Barcelona, Spain. Celtic Christianity will teach while claiming sacred silence and thin places of awareness on the Emerald Isle of Ireland. As Sabbath rest takes shape and an itinerary comes into focus, may God be glorified.

Every two weeks on Monday, Victoria Oliver, Dave & Lynn Pietz, and Chuck and Mary Bauer would fill the back of the Bauers' truck with our donations and take them to The Food Bank.

Now it is over. We have preliminary tallies, but all information is not in yet. We know that together, The Methodists' and Presbyterians' competition bringing donations of over 2,000 # has made a huge difference for the increasing number of people visiting The Food Bank. Monetary donations have also been wonderful; truly a blessing.

Shelves will be full for a while, but we've learned that Second Harvest has stopped delivering food donations to smaller communities, including those in Bonner and Boundary Counties. This is a huge loss, so our work is not over. We must keep donating to The Food Bank in 2023! More families and seniors find themselves in the position of needing supplemental food to make it through the month. First Presbyterian can continue donating and help offset the tremendous load The Food Bank is carrying.

Well done, congregations! The light of our love and caring for others in the community shines bright over First Presbyterian Church and United Methodist Church.

When the Membership Outreach and Mission team met in November, loads of exciting opportunities were explored in the brainstorming session. The next MOM meeting will be held on **Thursday**, **January 12, 2023 at 2:00 pm**. At that time the team can sort out priorities, create a 2023 calendar and develop plans.

One common theme is to safely get back together in person after the covid years of separation. Let's keep pondering how to reconnect with our friends, members and community. This is an ambitious list and these can not be accomplished without the help of volunteers. If you would like to be involved on this team or get involved in one or more of these opportunities please contact Judy Labrie or Judy McCommish.

Here is a taste of what may be to come in the coming year:

Membership Outreach Ministry:

- Interfaith Spring Event invite representatives from other faith traditions to share how they observe common themes of spring holy days. This peacemaking invitation could also include one of the local Tribes.
- 100,000 Poets for Change September 23, 2023; support the Bonner County Human Rights Task Force & Lost Horse Press as they continue to host the 100,000 Poets for Change event at on the church lawn. Perhaps invite someone from the Kalispel Tribe to read or present something.
- Hikes, walks, experiences in the natural world These events could be informative and/or a spiritual guided experience. Dave Pietz has ideas of trail locations.
- Place a photo next to the names of people in the church directory request simple black & white photos from members and friends so they can be added to the church directory.
- Send cards to visitors, members, home-bound, etc. Valentine's Day, February 14, 2023 cards; explore other ways to reach out with cards.
- Fellowship hour every Sunday Let's start meeting after worship again so friends and members can catch up and visit. Explore hosting options so set-up & clean-up are shared by helpers.
- Greeting visitors explore how to make sure visitors are warmly, properly greeted.
- House dinners explore how church friends and members can rotate hosting small-group dinners again.

<u>Mission Ministry:</u>

- Bike & Build in August, 2023 3 days, 2 nights hosting young adults biking across the country to shed light on helping people who lack housing.
- Ukrainian family support in Sandpoint apparently there are at least 2 families from Ukraine who are resettling locally. We would like to know more about what the families need and how they can be gently, respectfully supported under these circumstances.
- Food Tax Project explore the bills before the Idaho legislators that would eliminate at least some of the taxes levied on food in Idaho. This is would help people in poverty.

Workshops and Retreat possibilities:

Series on the Spiritual Practice of Simplicity; present on local food (why factory farming is harmful), consumerism/materialism, travel, composting-urban and rural, recycling & reusing, avoiding plastic and refilling. Show the astronaut video. Partner with the Earth Care Team

End of life series - caretaking self-care, how to show up, resources, hospice, 5 Wishes planning Dream Workshop - exploring how can looking deeply into our dreams help understand ourselves

Happy New Year!

As we start a new year, many of us may be accustomed to reflecting on the past year and at the same time making plans for the year ahead. That is certainly the case for this finance update as we look at preliminary 2022 end of year information alongside 2023 projections.

2023 Stewardship Pledge Update: Much appreciation to those completing a stewardship pledge. This info helps establish the budget for the coming year. At the end of December FPC pledges for the 2023 budget totaled \$91,140.00. The chart below shows the change from 2022 to 2023 with total pledges about \$19,000 less in 2023. If you haven't done so and still wish to complete a pledge form, a copy of the pledge information is included at the end of this note. Based on this information, the projected budget for 2023 has been reduced \$30,000.


